

**2021 WARRANT**  
**TOWN OF PALMYRA**

State of Maine                  County of Somerset  
To Diane White, resident of Palmyra in said county,

**Greetings:**

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of Palmyra, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Palmyra Community Center in Palmyra on Friday the 12<sup>th</sup> day of March, A.D. 2021 at 7:45 a.m., then and there to act on Articles One and Two, to then adjourn and reassemble at the Palmyra Community Center on Saturday the 13<sup>th</sup> day of March, A.D. 2021 at ten o'clock in the forenoon then and there to act on the remaining articles to wit:

Note: Election of Moderator will be at 7:45 a.m. and voting will be from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Friday March 12, 2021.

Art. 1            To elect a moderator by secret ballot to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2            To elect the following by secret ballot:  
Selectperson, Assessor and Overseer of the Poor  
– One member for a three year term.

Art. 3            To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$10,765 for Select Board member's compensation.

Art. 4            To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$44,800 for insurances, estimated breakdown as follows:

Health	22,000.00
Property & Casualty	14,000.00
Workers comp	6,600.00
Unemployment	<u>2,200.00</u>
Total	\$ 44,800.00

Art. 5            To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$135,000 for the Town Charge Account.

*Estimated expenditures as follows:*

A. Compensation	\$ 91,000
B. Contract Services	25,000
C. Utilities	6,000
D. Supplies/Fees	6,000
E. Lien Costs	<u>7,000</u>
Total	\$135,000

Art. 6 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$45,000 to maintain the Community Center. Estimated expenditures as follows:

A. Utilities	25,000
B. Maintenance/Repairs	15,000
C. <u>Contracted Services</u>	<u>5,000</u>
Total	45,000

Art. 7 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000 for utilities and maintenance for the Town Hall and Modular Building.

Art. 8 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$6,500 for assessing work. Any funds remaining at the end of the year will be placed in the investment account, which was set up previously for future assessing work.

Art. 9 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$19,500 for Code Enforcement and appropriate Plumbing Fees to this account.

Art. 10 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$20,000 for a sexton and maintenance to the town cemeteries. Interest earned from the Cemetery Investment account in 2020 to be credited to this account. Also to authorize the Select Board to enter into or continue contracts for cemetery maintenance and sexton.

Art. 11 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000 for cleaning and repair to cemetery stones.

Art. 12 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000 for General Assistance and appropriate funds reimbursed from the State of Maine.

Art. 13 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,672 for Maine Municipal Association dues.

Art. 14 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$250 for membership in the Seabasticook Valley Chamber of Commerce.

Art. 15 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$6,000 for the purchase of computers.

Art. 16 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$20,000 for anticipated gravel roadwork. Roadwork to be done will be decided by the Select Board.

Art. 17 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$72,574 for the first payment of funds borrowed for the purchase of a new truck.

*Note: This is the first of three annual payments due under a note executed by the Select Board on behalf of the Town and authorized by a vote of Town meeting on March 13, 2020.*

Art. 18 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$137,721 for the first payment of funds borrowed for paving.

*Note: This is the first of five annual payments due under a note executed by the Select Board on behalf of the Town and authorized by a vote of Town meeting on March 13, 2020.*

Art. 19 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$225,000 for the Public Works account. Estimated amounts in each category as follows:

Summer Roads	\$ 25,000
Winter Roads	80,000
Capital Road Improvements	40,000
Equipment/Garage	<u>80,000</u>
Total	\$225,000

Art. 20 To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$142,000 for the fifth payment of funds borrowed for paving and to raise \$42,000 and use LRA funds and remaining funds set aside for the Culvert Project.

*Note: This is the fifth of five annual payments due under a note executed by the Select Board on behalf of the Town and authorized by a vote of Town meeting on March 12, 2016.*

Art. 21 To see if the Town will vote to borrow up to \$200,000 (At an estimated interest rate of 2.90% ) for the purchase of a Truck. Also to authorize the Select Board to expend any funds necessary to execute the loan documents, said funds to be from the amount borrowed pursuant to this Article's passage or from the town charge account.

Validity:

The validity of the bonds and of the voters' ratification of the bonds may not be affected by any errors in the above estimates. If the actual amount of the total debt service for the bond issue varies from the estimate, the ratification by the electors is nevertheless conclusive and the validity of the bond issue is not affected by reason of the variance.

Treasurer, Town of Palmyra.

- Art. 22 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$65,000 for Fire Protection and to authorize the Select Board to continue/enter into contracts for this purpose.
- Art. 23 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$140,000 for Solid Waste Disposal, and appropriate reimbursements from Municipal Review Committee (MRC).
- Art. 24 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000 for the recycling program.
- Art. 25 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000 for legal expenses. This would include expenses associated with the sale of tax-acquired property, land-use violations and other legal expenses. Any fines and reimbursements will be credited to this account.
- Art. 26 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2500 for the Planning Board and Board of Appeals.
- Art. 27 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$9,000 for the Animal Control account and appropriate Dog License Fees.
- Art. 28 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000 for mileage and expenses for the Emergency Management Director and the Health Officer.
- Art. 29 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,500 for the Recreation Program.
- Art. 30 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$4,500 for maintenance of the Town Park and to authorize the Select Board to continue/enter into contracts for this purpose.
- Art. 31 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1000 for the Palmyra Scholarship Fund.
- Art. 32 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3000 for library services.

- Art. 33 To see if the Town will vote to give the revenue received from Inland Fisheries & Wildlife for snowmobile registrations to the Palmyra Snowmobile Club.
- Art. 34 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2600 for dues for Kennebec Valley Council of Governments (KVCOG).
- Art. 35 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following:  
Tri-Town Food Bank – \$1000  
Palmyra Soup Kitchen – \$1000  
Newport Food Bank – \$1000  
KVCAP Transportation Program - \$200  
Hospice of Somerset County - \$300

- Art. 36 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$10,000 for Repairs to the Town Hall, and credit any funds remaining at the end of the year to the Capital Improvements investment account.
- Art. 37 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5000 for restoration of vital records.
- Art. 38 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50,000 to set aside for a revaluation.
- Art. 39 To see if the Town will vote to take \$414.69 from surplus to ratify overdrafts in fiscal year 2020. (Cemetery Account - \$282.21, Loan Payment -\$132.48)
- Art. 40 To see if the Town will vote to charge interest on all unpaid taxes after such date the Town shall determine.
- Note - maximum allowed by the State Treasurer is 9 percent.  
Select Board recommend 5 percent to start 60 days from day of commitment.*
- Art. 41 To see if the town will vote to authorize the tax collector or treasurer to accept Pre-payments for taxes not yet committed, pursuant to 36 M.R.S.A. §506.
- Art. 42 To see if the Town will vote to authorize funds for Abatements to come from overlay.

- Art. 43 To see if the Town will vote to have the Select Board choose all necessary Town Officials for the ensuing year and fix compensation for same.
- Art. 44 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to spend an amount not to exceed three-twelfths (1/4) of the budgeted amount in each budget category of the 2021 annual budget during the period from January 1, 2022 to the Annual Town Meeting.
- Art. 45 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to obtain loan(s) in anticipation of taxes not to exceed fifty percent (50%) of the total commitment, such loans to be paid during the current fiscal year.
- Art. 46 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes, in such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property. And if they should choose to employ a bid process, the Select Board has the right to accept or reject any or all bids. Notices of tax acquired property sales will be posted in a newspaper that covers the local area.
- Art. 47 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to sell excess Town equipment and property.
- Art. 48 To see if the Town will vote to rollover the balance of the Veterans' Memorial account to this fiscal year and to authorize the Town to accept funds from individuals for the purchase of paving stones. These stones will be placed near the Veterans' Memorial to honor individuals chosen by the purchaser.
- Art. 49 To see if the Town will vote to continue the fund for the purpose of accepting donations for Palmyra's Christmas program known as the Giving Tree with any funds remaining in the account at the end of the year to be carried over to the next fiscal year.
- Art. 50 Shall the Town of Palmyra vote to authorize the Select Board to accept or reject grants, donations, and or gifts of money to the various accounts of the Town of Palmyra for FY2021 and to expend monies donated for specific purposes.

Art. 51 To see what sum the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to take from anticipated revenue and surplus to lower the 2021 Tax Commitment.
